It shall be the policy of the City of Deltona to support Deltona-based not-for-profit entities that sponsor citywide events for the benefit of all residents. A not-for-profit entity, in accordance with Florida Statutes, §617.01401 (5), shall mean an entity in which no part of the income or profit of which is distributable to its members, directors, or officers.

Entities who have at least three years of experience with community-wide festivals or activities and who expect to have 2,000 to 3,000 attendees at the event may apply for in-kind services. An entity seeking in-kind services shall submit an application to the City Manager specifying the nature and details of the benefits provided to Deltona residents, a summary of prior events including a demonstrated history of drawing at least 2,000 participants and the disposition of any funds raised during previous events. An entity may petition the City Commission to provide any or all of the following in-kind services by a majority vote:

1. Waive fees for permits.
2. Provide fire and first aid protection not to exceed twenty (20) billable hours.
3. Provide police protection not to exceed twenty (20) billable hours.

Subject: In-Kind Donations to Clubs and Organizations		Adopted by the Deltona City Commission at the Regular City Commission meeting held on September 8, 1999.	

It shall be the policy of the City of Deltona to support any Clubs or Organizations that sponsor citywide events for the benefit of all residents.

Organizations who have at least three years of experience with community-wide festivals or activities and who expect to have at least 5000 participants in a three-day period may apply for in-kind services. In addition to any funding that may be recommended by the Deltona Grants Advisory Board and approved by the City Commission, an organization may petition the City Commission to provide any or all of the following in-kind services by a majority vote.

1. Waive all fees for permits.
2. Waive all fees for the erection of banners.
3. Provide fire and first aid protection not to exceed twenty (20) billable hours.
4. Provide police protection not to exceed twenty (20) billable hours.
